


The moon is headed for the earth. A collision is now inevitable.




This disarming polyphony of voices betrays an authorial style suffused with a kindness that is reflected in the pastel-colored world of the visuals.

# Saturnine


### Baladi

A straw basket tossed on Pacific waves washes up on an island. There, red-furred monkeys take in the little girl found inside as one of their own. Years pass, and through a series of circumstances that owe as much to fate as chance, she finds herself adrift on the waves once more, until she encounters a ship, which will be her first confrontation with civilization...

While rereading and researching Tarzan, Baladi came across a little-known French precursor to the **Lord of the Jungle**: Saturnin Farandoul, created in 1879 by Albert Robida. Toying in his mind with the idea of rebooting the character, Baladi had the idea to turn Saturnin into Saturnine, and set the action on an island inhabited by monkeys that had already served as the backdrop to his adaptation of **The Swiss Family Robinson**. And just as he did in that book, Baladi employs a host of techniques here (pencils, paints, collage) as well as juggling genres (in the broadest sense of the word) to create an overtly political adventure comic that recalls Edgar Rice Burroughs as much as it does Francois Truffaut's **The Wild Child**.

# La Réparation


### Nina Bunjevac


The narrator of **La Réparation** dives deep into her memories and, through drawings, offers closure and redress for the hurt she experienced as a child. Bunjevac returns to a dark period in her life, daring, in the light of the present, to denounce abuses and above all, to comfort the little girl she once was, to protect her and mend the pain of her sufferings.



Time no longer seems to flow in a normal way. The universe is disintegrating, various layers of reality seemingly juxtaposed.


These are the end days, and yet there could be a Plan B to save the world, a great "backup" for a later date, for something... new?




Venera is a book to shake you up and make you think, while remaining a landmark of the imagination and the inner journey.







### **Mortis Ghost**







A single man finds an apartment in New York, in the heart of Manhattan, thanks to a couple of friends who decided to go back to live in France.




But as streamlined as they are, these boxes contain their share of stories while the sounds behind the thin walls are weighted with mystery.





# Nachave


### Lucas Harari







Growing up. Facing down other people, early disappointments, how people see you, the world's expectations. Coming to understand yourself, confiding in others. Becoming a person.




### Lorenzo Mattotti

In **Haunted**, she writes about all the difficulties she faced in her home country – whether at school or within her own family – and that compelled her to leave. More importantly, she tells how, when she arrived in Canada in 2016, she did not find herself more serene and continued to feel the pressure of religion and traditions that were instilled in her as a child. One day, that pressure suddenly appears as an old bigot and extremely conservative imaginary woman. An old lady who persecutes Shaghayegh, constantly condemning her western way of life.



However, when the young woman finds herself up to her neck in organized crime, Márcia will have to face huge risks to get her out of this predicament. Whether Jaqueline wants it or not.



**Shenzhen** is entertainingly compact with Guy Delisle's observations of life in urban southern China, sealed off from the rest of the country by electric fences and armed guards.

With a dry wit and a clean line, Delisle makes the most of his time spent in Asia overseeing outsourced production for a French animation company. By translating his fishout-of-water experiences into accessible graphic novels, Delisle skillfully notes the differences between Western and Eastern cultures, while also conveying his compassion for the simple freedoms that escape his colleagues in the Communist state.

He was sorely reminded of this condition in 2017, as he was about to fly to Canada to promote his graphic novel and visit his brother. Stranded at the airport by the airline, which did not know how to process his refugee travel documents, Neyestani faced a wall of incomprehension.

Three Hours details this long wait during which he can only observe his helplessness and the little attention given to those in his position. It is also an opportunity for this shy man who never dares to raise his voice or defend his interests to indulge in an exercise in self-reflection.

A poignant, sometimes funny and very honest story about a man forced into exile but whose host country still treats him too often as an intruder.

Based on interviews, **L'araignée de Mashhad** describes Saeed Hanaei's story, a man who murdered sixteen prostitutes and/or drug addicted women for religious reasons. These events all happened in the holy city of Mashhad, in the north-east of Iran. All the victims were brought to his home and strangled, hence Hanaei's nickname given by the media "The Spider Killer".

Juggling between genuine interviews and fictional parts, Neyestani not only reveals the killer's point of view, but the state of mind of his family, of the victims, and of the investigating judge as well. He sheds lights on the rigorist religious ideas in this city, one of the most conservative of Iran, where part of the population protested in support of the killer after his arrest. Through this true story, Neyestani describes a sick society in which the outcasts are not considered as humans.

This was the start of a very long journey, taking him and his wife to Turkey, China and then Malaysia before finally moving to Paris in 2011, where they now live as political refugees.

This graphic novel is his story.

Long story short, **Wonderland** is a work that resembles its author: rich in questioning and commitment, undeniably generous and deeply human.





A book of both jottings and memories, **Cascade** tackles the joyous chaos of thought and tries to give it shape(s), recalling the creator's paintings and album covers.


